What is Letterboxing?

Letterboxing is a recreational activity that combines elements of orienteering, puzzle-solving, and outdoor exploration. Participants use clues and navigational skills to locate hidden containers, or "letterboxes." Inside each letterbox is a rubber stamp and a logbook.

Letterboxing is a popular hobby worldwide, offering participants a fun way to explore nature while engaging in a treasure hunt-like adventure.



What supplies do you need?

For letterboxing, participants typically need a few basic supplies. The library will provide a personalized stamp and passport book for each participant. Each letterbox will contain a stamp pad, logbook, and custom stamp. With these supplies, participants can embark on their letterboxing adventure, marking their finds and leaving their own stamp behind.



How to participate this summer?

To participate in the library's weekly mission, visit our website weekly between June 16 and July 27 for updated clues. New clues are posted every Sunday. Follow the clues to locate each letterbox and stamp your passport book with the box's stamp. Use your personal stamp to mark the logbook, and share a selfie of your adventure through the library's Facebook Messenger or email. Bring in your completed passport for a prize.



Tips, Tricks, and Etiquette

*Respect the mystery and excitement by not spoiling the fun for others. Keep the locations secret. *Use discretion when retrieving letterboxes in public areas to avoid drawing unwanted attention. *Always return the letterbox to its original hiding spot to maintain the challenge for future seekers. *Contact the library if you encounter any issues with a letterbox, ensuring its maintenance and enjoyment for others. *Use sufficient ink on the stamp and press firmly to get a clear imprint in both your passport book and the logbook.
